Along with its traditional houses and farm, sure to melt your heart, Mirwart will delight visitors with its impressive castle, at the end of the main street. This historical building, first built in the 11th century, was modified along the centuries.

The Domaine Provincial

The **Domaine provincial**'s fish ponds, which stretch, at the foot of

the village, are open to visitors. Didactic signs present the local flora and fauna that can be found along the water. The site is of course very much loved by fishermen. The most common fish there is trout, mostly to help restock the region's rivers. The estate's woodlands also offer a wide range of walking paths, perfect for nature lovers.

A hidden gem: the icehouse

You will find it along a gentle walk in the forest... This building, used as a natural freezer and meant to keep food longer, dates to the 19th century. Only pipistrelle bats use it to sleep through the winter these days.
