- A *Tsuga mertensiana*, champion of Belgium
- A Vancouver fir (or giant fir), vice-champion of Belgium with its 48 m height and the citronella fragrance of its crushed needles
- Softwoods from the Rocky Mountains (West of the US)
- Tulip trees with their fascinating blooms
- Japanese larches, known for their vibrant yellow tint
- Sequoias and their timeless beauty
